## Programs for responsible students

- ▶ STARRSA Training: Klancy Street is the sole provider of training on the STARRSA CBT and AP programs.
- ▶ STARRSA CBT Manual: This cognitive behavior treatment intervention was developed to be delivered by a qualified and trained clinician.
- ▶ STARRSA AP Manual: This active psychoeducational intervention was developed to be delivered by a trained facilitator and does not need to be a licensed clinician.
